ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- 1. India, through the Government of Meghalaya (GoM), will implement the "Meghalaya Health Systems Strengthening Project" with the involvement of Department of Health and Family Welfare (DoHFW). The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (hereinafter the World Bank) will provide financing to GoM for the project.
- 2. India, through GoM, will implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (**ESSs**). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (**ESCP**) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for each of these.
- 3. India, through GoM, will also comply with the provisions of any other E&S documents required under the ESF and referred to in this ESCP, such as the Environmental and Social Management Framework (ESMF), site specific Environmental and Social Impact Assessments (ESIAs), Environmental and Social Management Plans (ESMPs), Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP), Bio-Medical Waste Management Plan (BMWMP) and Labour Management Procedures (LMP) and the timelines specified in those E&S documents.
- 4. India, through GoM, has overall responsibility for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by DoHFW referenced in 1 above.
- 5. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the World Bank by India, through GoM (through DoHFW) as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the World Bank will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
- 6. As agreed by the World Bank and India, through GoM, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, India, through GoM, will agree to the changes with the World Bank and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the World Bank and India, through GoM. The GoM will promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, India, through GoM, shall provide additional funds (to DoHFW), if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts, which may include environmental, health, and safety, labor, and gender-based violence related impacts.
